COLONEL DAVE SNYDER







He was a true "Southern Colonel" being given that official title in the 70's by a southern governor. He was very active in the chapter's annual Rush to the Rockies for many years, always donating several types of German beer to be enjoyed by the attending members.

Colonel Dave Snyder will be greatly missed by members of the chapter as well as anyone who was lucky enough to call him Friend. I'm sure that if God drinks beer, you can bet that He is being served a frosty mug of German beer by the Colonel. GOD BLESS!!!

ABA XXXIV has come and gone, but the great memories will live on. A total of 103 members attended the event with 155 walk-ins at the Saturday Trade Show. The vendors were happy.



On Tuesday, the four home tours were outstanding, and I was able to bring home a celluloid Neef match safe from **Ed Beckman's** home and return it to CO where it belongs. This makes four of these that are displayed in our COLUMBINE members' homes. **Chris Pastor**, (ABA's 4th president) had his home open, displaying his massive collection of Coors items. Carlos and Lily Gallegos were featured in the June 2015 issue of SLUG MAGAZINE. Following are some excerpts from the article.

I had the pleasure of meeting someone who has spent the past four-plus decades of his adult life collecting the relics of Utah's beer history and saving them from disappearing into obscurity: **Carlos Gallegos**. After many years collecting, Carlos became known as the "Utah Guy" among his fellow collectors in the breweriana world.

As a member of the United States Air Force and as an aviation contractor, Carlos has

enjoyed a well-traveled career that has taken him to many destinations around the world. He developed his appreciation for beer while stationed at Ramstein Air Base in Germany. He still believes the best beers in the world come from Germany.

He began to appreciate not only the beer but also how the cans and bottles reflected the regions

he was in. "I was really drawn to the diversity and the artwork of some of the beer advertisements that I was coming across," says Carlos. "Every trip away, I'd come home with a few cans or bottles and display them in the house." Now, the walls, shelves and display cases that inhabit the Gallegos home are a historical tribute to the fogotten breweries and beer that played an important part in the development of Utah and the Intermountain West. "I started collecting the whole world, but there's just too much," Carlos says, "so then I downsized to just America, then to the Western U.S., and finally to the Intermountain area: Utah, Idaho, Wyoming and Colorado." Many of his brewery collectables' names may be unfamiliar to most Utahans, like The Salt

Lake Brewing Company, Becker Brewing and Fisher Brewing Co.

People know that if they come across a special find that is Utah-related, Carlos is their first contact. His expertise has turned Carlos into a bit of a local historian when it comes to Utah's brewing past. "There are so many breweries that were lost to time in the early days of the Utah territory," Carlos says. "There are some historical documents and photos that still exist

our past has been obscured throughout the last century, like the fact that at one time, Brigham Young and many Latter Day Saints were in the alcohol business here in Utah."

Few have seen the Gallegos Collection because it's a private collection, but as Carlos says, chuckling, "You can't take it with you. I'm getting up there in years, and it's getting to the point where it's time to share some of what I have with the rest of Utah. I'm going to leave

a few with my grandson Matthew Gallegos, who has shown a great interest in collecting Utah's breweriana. The rest I'd like to go to a select group of individuals that truly care about Utah's beer history." One of those stewards of



from some of them, but there are only a few tangible items that have survived to the present that show how our local beers connected to the people of Utah and reflected how they lived."

One of the prized pieces from the Gallegos Collection is a pre-Prohibition comemmorative mug from *Pabst Brewing Company*, adorned with an image of then-Governor **Brigham Young**. "I've done a lot of research on this mug," says Carlos. "Pabst has no records authorizing its production, but it clearly has their authorized stamp on the bottom. I think they produced only a couple dozen or so of these locally, of which only a handful exist today. Pieces like this remind me that part of

Utah's brewing past is *Beerhive Pub* owner and

author of *Beer in the Beerhive*, Del Vance, who says "Some of these pieces are in mint condition, and they are truly works of museum-quality art. There are a few that I'll keep in my home, but I've chosen some of the more remarkable pieces to display at the *Beerhive* for anyone to see." The *Beerhive Pub* is already known to be a museum to Utah's beer history, and the added Gallegos memorabilia just adds to the appeal. The *Beerhive* is located at 128 S. Main Street in Salt Lake City.



Tell, summer is over, schools have restarted, and the 2015 beer conventions have come and gone. Shirley and I had a wonderful time in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Before spending five days there, we got to spend three nights with our daughter and son-in-law, Cynthia and Mark Sandifer, in Crown Point, Indiana. We had a great Sunday afternoon going to five craft breweries in northern Indiana. At **Malt Brothers Brewery** in St. John, I managed to get a pint glass, some stickers, coasters, and a 16 oz. IPA canned. They had been open only 2 weeks!

Our next stops were at four micros in Griffith. New Oberfalz Brewing, Pokro Brewery, and Wild Rose Brewing had all been open over a year. Windmill Micro Brewery was the last stop. We obtained coasters at all of them.

Monday afternoon we arrived at the Hilton Hotel in Milwaukee for the BCCA Canvention 45 and the Brewery Collectibles World Convention 2. This collector's show was the largest I have ever attended. There were 817 members and 324 guests in attendance. That makes a total of 1,141 attending. The large convention hall across the street had 730 six-foot tables for everyone to show their wares. We all got in miles of walking in both places. There were 41 states and 22 countries represented. At the World Conference meeting, it was voted to hold the 2017 convention in Poland and the 2019 in Argentina. In 2016, the BCCA Annual Canvention will be in Portland, Oregon at the Red Lion Inn, the same place as the 1986 show. It has been refurbished since then.

Sunday, we had a pleasant trip to the **ABA Museum in Potosi**, and on to Lancaster, Wisconsin, where we spent the night with **Rick and Jeri Natter**. Had a great time with them. Left the next day for home, where we arrived on Tuesday afternoon. We had driven a total of 2,318 miles. Had a wonderful trip.

And now to what everyone wants to know: "Rush To The Rockies" in 2016. The "Rush" will be in Fort Collins on April 28th to 30th at the Marriott Hotel, where we used to be. The rate is \$109 per night, with no banquet. We are hoping for a great turnout at this show. In Milwaukee, we passed out flyers and received a lot of praise about our past shows, and indications that many are planning to make the "Rush" again.

For the can collectors, I am passing along the latest info on "craft cans in Colorado." My latest composite has 350 12-oz. cans and 162 in larger sized ones. I started collecting these cans 13 years ago and thought I would get a total of about 150 craft cans from Colorado. Oscar Blues was the first Colorado craft brewery to put beer in cans, back in 2002.

Coasters are still coming out from everywhere. I got over 300 for my collection in Milwaukee. I'm still working on a set that I heard about since getting home. **Douglas County Library** in Colorado is sponsoring a set of coasters for eight different craft breweries in their area. If you get coasters from five of them, you can get a beer glass from the library.

My local brewery, **Grimm Brothers Brewing**, just had a great "Octoberfest" celebration and I'm sure that other breweries in the state have had great ones, too. Speaking of Octoberfest, we always think of GABF! The list of CO entries and winners is on the next two pages.

To finish, I have a "quirky" beer name to pass along to you. **Adelbert Brewing** in Austin, Texas just came out with their newest beer, "Scratchin Hippo." I have a new name for the next beer from the Austin brewery. They can call it the "Short Giraffe."

The beer can be found in now in New Belgium folly 12 packs. The ice cream is sold in scoop shops.

In addition to being a new adventure in flavor, the collaboration is geared to raise awareness and spur activism surrounding climate change. The two companies will donate a portion of sales to "Protect Our Winters" or "POW," which works within the snow sports community to fight climate change.







OF OUTDOOR BEER SIGNS

The Orange Brewery in Orange, New Jersey was completed in April, 1902. They produced a Pilsener Beer, an Ale, a Porter style beer, and Export Beer, available in area pubs and taverns, as well as bottled delivery by horse-drawn wagons (and later by motor truck) to one's own front doorstep.

This 1916 photograph taken outside of the brewery displays barrels and bottled beer ready for local delivery. With talk of Prohibition and the temperance movement gaining momentum in America, owner Michael Winter makes a political statement to the contrary with signage on his trucks to those who would propose to do away with the consumption of alcohol and spirits: "Beer Is The Best Temperance Drink In The World." However, the advent of Prohibition ended the brewing careers of the Winter brothers as beer barons, and their brewing operation at the Orange Brewery ceased by late 1919. The Orange Brewery sold to new owners in about 1925 and the building was demolished in 1980.
